#### **Counsellor's Corner**

Course selection for 2023/24 school year

Students can view their course requests for next year on the Aspen student portal found on students' virtual commons. Students should review the courses they have chosen for next year on the 'my info' tab found at the top of the home page. Click on 'current schedule' and then click on the 'requests' tab found on the left. Students should contact their guidance counsellors if they would like to make changes to their course selections for next year. Grade 12 students interested in returning next year must contact their guidance counsellor.

#### **OUAC and OCAS**

Marks have been submitted to OUAC and OCAS. Students should check their account to make sure all information is accurate. Students must accept offers of admission in their OUAC and OCAS accounts, and they must do so by the published deadline dates provided by the post-secondary institutions.

#### **Graduation Information**

Celebrating the Class of 2023! Mark the date – June 29, 12:00 Graduation Mass at Blessed Sacrament Church and 6:00 Graduation Ceremony in the Holy Cross Gymnasium.

Graduating students will be invited to an information assembly on May 16<sup>th</sup> during period 4. Invitations for graduating students and 4 tickets per graduate will be made available on Thursday, June 1<sup>st</sup> in Student Services.

#### **Community Service Requirement for Graduates**

Graduating students should submit their volunteer hours no later than May 31st to ensure the community service graduation requirement is met. Students are required to submit 40 hours, but if they submit 80 hours or more, they will receive a Crusader Certificate at the graduation ceremony.

#### Summer Learning Programs 2023

The ALCDSB is offering full credit summer school courses from July 3- July 28th. Courses are delivered on-line and are asynchronous. #### Scholarship

The Lennox & Addington Stewardship Council (www.lastewardship.ca) promotes responsible land care and stewardship of our natural environment. The Council is pleased to offer the Bursary Program again this year. The name of the award honours David Sexsmith, a former chair of the Stewardship Council who passed away three years ago. David was a very inspiring advocate for the environment and for student participation. This year, the bursary is \$750.00 for one student. Note that students must reside in Lennox & Addington County to be eligible. Priority will be given to students applying to Environmental Studies or Natural Resources programs at a recognized community college or university. Students applying to programs in science-related fields such as sustainable agriculture will be considered as well. An asset will be leadership roles in environmental projects, school events and volunteer work in the community. 

#### What would I do as a member of the Student Engagement Committee?

The committee meets virtually three times per year. You would join 30 students from across the province to share ideas about how EQAO can improve our programs. There are also small tasks to complete between meetings.

#### Who is eligible to apply?

You can apply for this opportunity if you are a student at an Ontario school in grades 7–12 during the 2023-24 school year.

EQAO celebrates student diversity across the province. When selecting committee members, representation of students' experiences and perspectives is of utmost importance.

#### How long would I serve on the committee?

Committee members' terms will be one school year. EQAO is currently seeking applications from students interested in joining the committee for the 2023-24 school year.

#### How do I apply?

- ✓ <u>Step 1</u>: Discuss your interest in serving on this committee with your parent or guardian, and your school principal or vice-principal. If you are selected to be on the committee, we will require written permission from your parent or guardian, and support from your principal.
- ✓ <u>Step 2</u>: Please complete the application form found at <u>https://forms.gle/iowLwKAqiM6RR7T37</u>. You may submit your personal narrative in writing (250-350 words) or in video format (3-5 minutes).

#### When will I know if I have been selected?

The deadline for applications is June 2, 2023. EQAO will inform successful applicants by the end of June 2023.

#### Help us provide healthy food for students at your school

The Food Sharing Project is a registered charity that has been serving the area for almost 40 years. We are the organization which provides nutritious food and equipment to schools across Kingston, Frontenac and Lennox and Addington for their in-school breakfast, lunch and hearty snack programs.

Each week of the school year, our team of 12 volunteers pack about 450 boxes of fresh fruit and vegetables, whole grains, dairy and protein foods which are delivered to every school in KFL&A, including yours. In 2019, prior to the onset of COVID-19, we sent food with a value of \$12,000 to schools each week and in 2022, that amount rose to \$21,000 per week.

The 2022-2023 school year has been unprecedented for The Food Sharing Project. Due to increasing demand and the skyrocketing costs of food, we are facing a significant budget shortfall as we are now sending out over \$25,000 in food every week. We need your help to ensure that students do not go through the school day hungry. Please consider making a donation to help us continue to get healthy food to students at your school.

Educators and research tell us that when they can eat nutritious food at school, students are more engaged in their learning, can focus better on tasks and can have more positive social interactions throughout the day. They are also more willing to try something new, which can lead to better food choices as adults.



#### FOR GROUPS

Aventuro Canada Exchanges (ACE) is administered by Paul Brown and Patrick Mulvihill, both Members in Good Standing with the Ontario College of Teachers.

The Directors have over 60 years of experience as teachers and school administrators. Paul Brown and Patrick Mulvihill founded Canada International Student Placement Inc. (www.cispi.ca) in 2015 and are proud to have been selected as the Aventuro Canada Exchange representatives. Aventuro, headquartered in Berlin Germany, and is a global network specializing in international reciprocal family exchanges for students.



#### WHO

- Algonquin & Lakeshore Catholic District School Board is pleased to announce a group exchange program for students aged 13-17 in partnership with Aventuro Canada Exchanges (ACE).
- Eligible students are invited to apply for a reciprocal exchange to Bretagne (Brittany) France.
- You will travel to France and attend school for one month living with your matched homestay family. Then you will host your exchange "brother" or "sister" for one month in your Canadian home and school.
- Two students, two families, one friendship for life.

#### WHAT

- Students will be immersed in French and will attend classes with French students and live with a French family during their stay.
- The French participant will attend your Algonquin & Lakeshore Catholic District school for one month immersed in English and live with your family during their stay. Fees (\$2200) include:
- One month stay in Bretagne France (Vannes and area) with your exchange family.
- One month of schooling at a French government approved school.
- All inclusive travel insurance including accidental health, trip cancellation, and one checked bag (not exceeding airline limits).
- Ground transportation to and from the airport in France.
  Students will be accompanied to France with a
- representative from ALCDSB
- An Aventuro representative in France and Canada can be contacted 24/7 during the exchanges.
- All air travel includes adult chaperones
- Additional Fees:
- Round-trip airfare from Pearson International Airport to Nantes, France arranged by Aventuro Canada Exchanges.
- Ground transportation to and from Pearson

#### WHERE

Participants will head to the city of Vannes and area. Vannes is located in the province of Bretagne around 100 kilometres (62 miles) northwest of Nantes and 450 km (280 miles) south west of Paris. Vannes was settled by the Romans approximately 2000 years ago. It is a walled city and its Catholic cathedral dates back to at least the 15th Century. Vannes is a market town linked to the sea. The current population of Vannes is approximately 60000 and the closest airport is in Nantes.

#### WHEN

- Algonquin & Lakeshore Catholic District School Board students will travel to Vannes in October 2023.\* Students will return to Canada approximately one month later.
- French students will travel to Canada in early April and return to France approximately one month later.
   \* Travel itineraries to be set.

#### WHY

- International Reciprocal Exchanges are not just about languages.
- Cultural Reciprocal International Exchanges are enriching and life changing for the whole family.
- Participants will have the opportunity to be fully immersed in the French language and culture.
- You will live with your French host family participating in all family activities.
   Families will be matched before you travel allowing
- Families will be matched before you travel allowing participants and parents to communicate before you meet in person.
- Aventuro exchanges are designed to provide you with the best cultural and linguistic experiences that tourism cannot provide.
- Two students, two families, one friendship for life.

All Aventuro participants and families will be screened by the local Aventuro representative(s). School administrators must approve each participant's application to be considered. All Canadian and French participants and their families will meet the public health guidelines communicated by the Algonquin & Lakeshore Catholic District School Board.
