LEARNING OPTIONS

REMOTE LEARNERS – For students who chose from the Director's Survey to complete the ENTIRE Quad online the following will apply:

Students will access their classes remotely for the entire Quad 3. Students will not be allowed to flip between Remote Learning and In-Person learning.

Students must be logged into TEAMS by 8:30 am for morning classes and 11:55 am for afternoon classes.

Students who are not on TEAMS when attendance is taken will be marked absent.

Students who are remote learners may not participate in any on-site

IN-PERSON LEARNER – Students are reminded to follow all COVID-19 Protocols and complete the Daily Screener before coming to school. <u>COVID-19 school screening (ontario.ca)</u>

ATTENDANCE - IN PERSON LEARNERS

o Isolation or Illness: Students will need to isolate for 5 days and therefore will access class material asynchronously to begin and then synchronously until their isolation ends and they can return to school. This applies to any student who knows they will be absent for at least two days due to illness or isolation.

For any other absences, students may access course materials asynchronously via D2L and will receive any missing materials upon return to class.

University/College Applications

Applicants should notice the application centre deadlines for equal consideration for admission to programs. University applications were due by Thursday, January 13th and college applications by Tuesday, February 1st. Students are asked to ensure that all data on the application is accurate (including contact and transcript information). Please contact Student Services with any concerns.

Grade 9 Registration

Grade 8 students from partner schools have received registration packages in their grade 8 classes. Registration packages for non-feeder schools are now available in Student Services. Check the Holy Cross website, HCtoday.ca for an informational video as well as registration forms. Registration forms are due back to Holy Cross by March 7th.

Course Changes

Students who require a timetable change may do so within 5 days of the start of the quadmester. The last day to change courses is Wednesday February 9th.

Course Selection Process

At this time of year, students will begin the process of selecting courses for the 2022-2023 academic year. It is critical for all students who plan on returning to Holy Cross that they follow the timelines in order to ensure that they are able to obtain the courses they desire. Student services will be conducting the on-line process of selection of courses during the month of February. Information will be made available to students in their classes and also on the Guidance Page found on the students' Virtual Commons.

EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics

Starting in the 2021–2022 school year, students enrolled in the MTH1W Grade 9 de-streamed mathematics course will be learning the knowledge and skills that are defined in the expectations found in the new 2021 Ontario mathematics curriculum.

What Is in the EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics?

The Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics is a computer-based assessment. This year, the assessment will consist of various types of questions, including technology-enhanced items, such as drag and drop, drop-down menu, and single-and multiple-select items.

There are 50 questions on the assessment in total. Students will have the opportunity to participate in an introductory session that will familiarize them with the Grade 9 assessment. During this introductory session, students will have access to a sample test of 25 questions that shows the various types of questions.

Students will complete the online assessment in two sessions. Student enrolled in Grade 9 Math during Quadmesters 3 and 4 will complete the assessment in their scheduled Math classes during each Quad. At the end of the two assessment sessions, students will be presented with a questionnaire that asks them about their attitudes and perceptions with respect to mathematics. More information with dates for the assessment in each Quad will be shared once determined.

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

The OSSLT measures whether students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9. Successful completion of the literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. All students across the province write this test.

This school year, EQAO will be offering the OSSLT online. The assessment will be available to students participating in **in-person learning and working toward their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)**. This will allow the opportunity for students in Grades 10 and 11, and non-graduating Grade 12 students, to attempt the test and, if successful, have it counted on their transcript.

Because the Ministry of Education has waived the literacy graduation requirement for all students graduating during the 2021–2022 school year, graduating students do not need to complete the OSSLT test this year.

During the last school year (2020-21) students in Grade 10 had the opportunity to become familiar with the online test and its platform through EQAO's online practice test. Students currently in Grade 11 this academic year completed the online assessment at school this past

November 2021. The results of the assessment will be shared with students and their families once they are received by the school.

There is an online practice test available that comprises two sessions, which include content from previous tests. The practice test is equivalent to the two sessions students will be completing during the live test later this spring. In addition, the practice test includes an introductory session that allows students to become familiar with the new online platform's tools and functions. Students in Grade 10 THIS YEAR will be provided the opportunity to familiarize themselves with this new online platform throughout their classes in Quadmester 3. Grade 10 students will then complete the OSSLT later this year (Quadmester 4 - Spring 2022). More detailed information will be shared with specific dates as we receive more information from our School Board.

The school Literacy Committee is working diligently to provide support, materials and information to both students and teachers in order to best prepare students for the upcoming assessment. A D2L course is available for students that contains numerous practice tips and materials to help prepare for the assessment. We encourage students and parents to visit the course by clicking this link: Homepage-"OSSLT" Literacy Test- Prep Materials (elearningontario.ca) <a href="As students are required to be in-class learners at the time the online test will be administered at the school, any Grade 10 students that are studying remotely at the time the assessment is scheduled will be contacted to determine arrangements to write the assessment.
