Counsellor's Corner

Course selection for 2022/23 school year

Students can view their course requests for next year on the Aspen student portal found on students' virtual commons. Students should review the courses they have chosen for next year on the 'my info' tab found at the top of the home page. Click on 'current schedule' and then click on the 'requests' tab found on the left. Students should contact their guidance counsellors if they would like to make changes to their course selections for next year. Grade 12 students interested in returning next year should contact their guidance counsellor.

OUAC and OCAS

Marks have been submitted to OUAC and OCAS. Students should check their account to make sure all information is accurate. Students must accept offers of admission in their OUAC and OCAS accounts, and they must do so by the published deadline dates provided by the post-secondary institutions.

Community Service Requirement for Graduates

For the 2021-22 school year, the Ministry of Education has revised the 40-hour community involvement graduation requirement so that students will not be adversely impacted by the ongoing challenges related to COVID-19. For students graduating in the 2021-22 school year, the community involvement graduation requirement will be reduced to a minimum of 20 hours of community involvement activities. This recognizes that graduating students have had barriers to earning their community involvement hours last school year and there may be continued barriers this school year. Students can include activities that are performed at home and for family members. Graduating students should submit their volunteer hours by May 31st to ensure the community service graduation requirement is met.

Summer Learning Programs 2022

The ALCDSB is offering full credit summer school courses from July 4- July 29th. Courses are delivered on-line and are asynchronous. The following courses will be offered:

- Careers/Civics in English and French
- Senior English: NBE 3U, ENG4C and ENG4U and OLC4O
- Mathematics: MCR 3U, MCF 3M, MHF 4U, MAP 4C

The Secondary Co-op credit courses that will be offered include:

• Co-op: 1 or 2 Credits: Placement #1- July 4th – July 29th (1st credit), Placement #2: August 2nd – August 26th (2nd credit)

Summer Company Program

Kingston Economic Development Corporation is pleased to announce that applications for the 2022 Summer Company Program are open for secondary and post-secondary students. Students are provided with hands-on business training, support and mentorship throughout the summer months, and provided funding to start their business venture. Eligible students must be between the ages of 15 - 29, enrolled with a secondary or a postsecondary institution for the fall of 2022 and must dedicate at least 35 hours per week towards developing and running their business. Applications are open until: • Early acceptance deadline – April 29, 2022 • Final application deadline – May 23, 2022

The Summer Company program is funded by the Government of Ontario through the Ministry of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade and is delivered by the Kingston Economic Development Corporation. The program provides access to \$3,000 in start-up funding to help the students set-up and run their start-up over the summer. Students will develop and foster new relationships with local professionals and help them discover how their own ideas can help contribute to the economic development of our region. Lennox and Addington Stewardship Council Bursary

The Council is pleased to offer the David Sexsmith Bursary Program. David was a very inspiring advocate for the environment and for student participation. This year, the bursary is \$500.00 for one student.

Note that students must reside in Lennox & Addington County to be eligible. Priority will be given to students applying to Environmental Studies or Natural Resources programs at a recognized community college or university. Students applying to programs in science-related fields such as sustainable agriculture will be considered as well. Building communities of faith, service, and lifelong learning



Students and their families are invited to complete the See Me in ALCDSB survey, our first-ever student census, from May 9 to 20.

The survey will collect student demographic and identity data, including information about language, gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity and more. It also includes questions about school experience.

Why are we doing a student census?

Every day, we work to build faith-filled learning communities. We want our students and families to feel loved, inspired, and successful. By better understanding our students, we can make sure that the programs, supports and opportunities best suit their needs.

- Collect accurate identity and experience data about the current student population
- Improve our ability to assess the disparities that exist within the system and to effectively measure efforts to improve outcomes for all students

Support the development of 2022-2023 school improvement plans and the board improvement plan and inform new and existing programming and supports

The collection of this data is mandated by the Ministry of Education and is an important step forward for equity in the ALCDSB because it allows us to understand the ever-changing context in our schools.

Survey implementation

The See Me in ALCDSB survey is voluntary—but the more responses, the better. The survey will take place every three years to maintain accurate data to measure the impact of changes and new programs we put in place.

Here's some information about how the survey will be implemented to help you prepare:

- The survey will take place online. We will provide help for students with special education needs and families who need support.
- There are three versions of the survey: Kindergarten to Grade 3, Grades 4 to 8 and Grades 9 to 12.
- Students in Grades 9 to 12 will be given the survey directly and have time to complete the survey at school. The survey is voluntary. Students and families can choose not to participate or skip a question or questions on the survey. Parents/guardians of students under 18 may also request that their child not participate in the survey. Exemption requests must be submitted by **April 30**.

Holy Cross Catholic Secondary School students will be provided time in their morning classes between May 10th and May 18th. Your child's participation in the survey can help us identify how we can best support all members of our community—it's a simple thing you can do that could significantly impact the well-being of other children and families in your community.
