OUAC and OCAS

Quadmester 3 marks have been submitted to OUAC and OCAS. Students should check their account to make sure all information is accurate. Students must accept offers of admission in their OUAC and OCAS accounts, and they must do so by the published deadline dates provided by the post-secondary institutions. Students should also ensure that they have all required courses to be eligible for the program they are accepting.

Ontario University Admission Information Service

Starting June 3, Ontario high school students can use the Admission Information Service to find possible openings at Ontario universities. Visit www.ouac.on.ca/ouac101 and click 'Search Open Programs". See your guidance counsellor for more information.

OSAP

Ontario has launched applications for the 2022-23 Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) for full-time students. Students can now apply to the OSAP program for the 2022-23 school year for help with their postsecondary education costs. Students who have questions about OSAP or the OSAP application can contact the Financial Aid Office at the college or university they plan to attend.

Community Service Requirement for Graduates

For the 2021-22 school year, the Ministry of Education has revised the 40-hour community involvement graduation requirement so that students will not be adversely impacted by the ongoing challenges related to COVID-19. For students graduating this school year, the community involvement graduation requirement will be reduced to a minimum of **20 hours** of community involvement activities. This recognizes that graduating students have had barriers to earning their community involvement hours last school year and there may be continued barriers this school year. Students can include activities that are performed at home and for family members. Graduating students must submit their volunteer hours by June 15 to ensure the community service graduation requirement is met.

ASPEN Student portal – course selection for 2022/23 school year

Students can view course requests for next year on the Aspen student portal found on students' virtual commons. Students should review the courses they have chosen for next year on the 'my info' tab found at the top of the home page. Click on 'current schedule' and then click on the 'requests' tab found on the left. Students should contact their guidance counsellors if they would like to make changes to their course selections for next year. Grade 12 students interested in returning next year should contact their guidance counsellor.

EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics

Throughout the 2021–2022 school year, students enrolled in the MTH1W Grade 9 de-streamed mathematics course have been learning the knowledge and skills that are defined in the expectations found in the new 2021 Ontario Mathematics Curriculum.


What Is in the EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics?

The Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics is a computer-based assessment. This year, the assessment will consist of various types of questions, including technology-enhanced items, such as drag and drop, drop-down menu, and single-and multiple-select items.

There are 50 questions on the assessment in total. Students will have the opportunity to participate in an introductory session that will familiarize them with the Grade 9 assessment. During this introductory session, students will have access to a sample test of 25 questions that shows the various types of questions.

Students will complete the online assessment in two sessions. Students currently enrolled in Grade 9
Math during Quadmester FOUR will complete Session A of the assessment on Monday, JUNE 20th
and then Session B on TUESDAY, 21st. At the end of the two assessment sessions, students will be presented with a questionnaire that asks them about their attitudes and perceptions with respect to mathematics.

We wish all of our Grade 9 students much success as they complete this assessment in their Math classes this final Quadmester.


Activities will include:
