Post-Secondary Information

Students interested in applying to Ontario Universities can now pick up their OUAC access codes. Students require these codes to create an application on the Ontario University Application Center (www.ouac.on.ca). Students interested in applying to Ontario Colleges do **not** need these access codes. The college application is found on the ontariocolleges.ca website, and students require their OEN (Ontario education number) which is found on the student's report card.

Students are encouraged to attend open houses and information sessions to learn more about individual post-secondary institutions. University event information, including virtual information sessions, can be found on www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca. Colleges are offering college Mondays throughout November College Mondays | ontariocolleges.ca.

Students are encouraged to view the post-secondary information power-point on the Guidance Page, which is found on the students' Virtual Commons. It is also can be found on the Holy Cross website in the Student Services link.

Graduation Information

Grade 12 students are reminded to check their timetables to make sure they have all necessary requirements for graduation purposes, as well as for post-secondary pre-requisites. Students are required to complete 40 hours of community service – please submit the community service completion form to Student Services.
