University applications are due to the Ontario University Application Center by Thursday, January 12th and college applications are due to the Ontario College Application Service by Wednesday, February 1st. Students are asked to ensure that all data on the application is accurate (including contact and transcript information). Please contact Student Services with any concerns.



Grade 9 and 10 students are welcome to come to room 207 from 2:45 – 4:00pm on Tuesdays for extra math help.



Semester 1 Final Examination Info & Other Important Dates

Please note that final exams and culminating activities for Semester One classes will take place during the <u>MORNING blocks only</u> beginning on Thursday, January 26th through Tuesday, January 31st:

Examinations will occur according to the following schedule in the examination period:

Exams will take place in the morning on each date according to the following timeline:

Junior Exams (Grades 9/10) will be written in their assigned classrooms according to above assigned dates:

Start Time: 8:30 am

End Time: 10:00 am

Senior Exams (Grades 11/12) will be written in the gymnasium according to the above assigned dates:

Start Time: 8:30 am

End Time: 10:30 am

Students will be expected to be in their classroom (Junior students) or the Gymnasium (Senior students) no later than 8:30 am, and in proper uniform. <u>Please make alternative transportation arrangements for your child(ren) following their morning exam</u>. There are NO afternoon classes on the dates listed above. For those students who cannot secure transportation home and are in attendance for the afternoon, the cafeteria will be available for students who need to wait until 2:30 pm for their regular transportation home (school bus).

*Some students may be writing their exams in the Learning Commons, as arranged by their Resource teachers. These students will be notified by their teachers prior to the examination period.

Please also note the following important dates:


Wednesday, February 1st, 2023 is reserved for inclement weather or other unexpected occurrences.
