# Counsellor's Corner

### Course Selection for 2023-24

Students have received information regarding the course selection process during grade assemblies offered on Thursday, February 9 by guidance counsellors. It is critical that students select their courses by Wednesday, March 10th. All students must access myBlueprint, which is found on their virtual commons, to select courses. The power point presentations, course selection worksheets and the course calendar booklet are available on the Guidance Page. Student Services will be offering course selection workshops in the Learning Commons during period 2 for grades 9 and 10 and during period 3 for grades 11 and returning grade 12. Please contact your child's guidance counsellor if you have any questions.

## Online Learning Graduation Requirement Opt-out Form

Students are required to earn two online learning credits to graduate from secondary school, beginning with every student who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year. The graduation requirement is intended to support students in developing familiarity and comfort with working and learning in a fully online environment, as well as developing digital literacy and other important transferable skills that will help prepare them for success after graduation and in all aspects of their lives.

Parents/guardians may choose to opt their child out of the mandatory online courses required for graduation. The following link offers parents the opt-out form. Parents will be required to enter their email address as well as their child's school board email address. Paper copies of the opt-out form are also available in Student Services.

## College/University Information

First semester final marks have been sent to OUAC and OCAS. A reminder that university and college applicants should check their university/college account to review their transcript information. Also, students should be aware that they must accept offers of admission in their OUAC or OCAS accounts by the deadline dates indicated by the post-secondary institution. The next transmission of marks to OCAS and to OUAC is on April 27th .

## **Eastern Ontario College Panel**

Holy Cross will be hosting an Eastern Region Panel Presentation for grade 11 students on Thursday, March 9 during period 4. Participating colleges will share a presentation about college programs, services, the application process, and program outcomes. # **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test**

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) measures whether students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9. This year, the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) is offering the computer-based online OSSLT to students in Grades 10 and 11, 12 students who are retaking the test. Successful completion of this literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

<u>Between March 27 and April 3, 2023</u>, our eligible <u>students currently in Grade 10</u> who are learning in person <u>will be taking part in the OSSLT</u>.

Students will complete the assessment in two sessions (Session A and Session B). Each session is designed to be completed in 60 minutes, and students will complete each session in one sitting. Additional time will be provided for any students who require it. After completing both sessions, students will be presented with a questionnaire that asks them about their experiences, attitudes and perceptions with respect to literacy.

Students have the opportunity to become familiar with the online test and its platform through EQAO's online practice test. Holy Cross is also offering After School Literacy Sessions once per week for the next several weeks to help prepare students in Grade 10 for this assessment. There are 2 sessions to choose from: **Tuesdays after school** (Feb. 14 to Mar. 21) or **Wednesdays after school** (Feb. 15 to Mar. 22). Each session runs from 2:45 – 4:00 pm in Room 256 (with Ms. Downey)

An Individual Student Report will be generated for each student after the scoring of the assessment.

# **Upcoming EQAO Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics**

Our students in the Grade 9 mathematics course (MTH1W) in Semester 2 who are learning in person will be taking part in the online Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics administered by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO). This assessment is administered province-wide and has been developed by Ontario teachers and assessment experts. It is designed to allow students to demonstrate their skills and knowledge relating to mathematics as described in *The Ontario Curriculum, Grade 9: Mathematics* (2021).

On Thursday June 14th and Friday June 15th students currently enrolled in Grade 9 Destreamed Math (MTH1W) who are learning in person will be taking part in the EQAO Math Assessment.


Students will complete the assessment in two sessions (Session A and Session B). Each session will be completed in one sitting and will take approximately 60 minutes to complete. The assessment uses a multi-stage computer adaptive testing model that adapts to the individual student's performance as the student progresses through each session. Students will also be presented with a questionnaire.

After the assessment sessions are complete, teachers will receive an Individual Student Report for each student. Results from this assessment may be included as part of a student's final course mark.

Students will have the opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions on the online assessment and its platform through EQAO's online sample test.


