#### **SOLAR ECLIPSE**

#### IMPORTANT MESSAGE

#### Solar eclipse:

The upcoming solar eclipse on April 8 will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience. The eclipse process is expected to start at approximately 2:09 p.m., peaking at 3:22, and end with the full re-emergence of the sun at 4:34 p.m. The ALCDSB is facilitating the distribution of viewing glasses as a courtesy provided by Queens University Department of Physics, Engineering Physics and Astronomy. We are not mandating participation in this event, however if you do choose to participate in active viewing, please consider the following tips provided by the local Health Units:

#### Here are some tips to help your family enjoy the event safely:

- Looking at the sun without proper eye protection can cause permanent vision damage. Solar eclipse glasses that meet international standard ISO 12312-2 are needed to safely view the eclipse.
- Regular sunglasses, no matter how dark, will not protect your eyes.
- When using eclipse glasses, ensure they are not scratched or damaged.
- Don't use a regular camera or phone lens to view the eclipse. It can hurt your eyes and your device.

It is important to supervise children during solar viewing activities to ensure they don't look at the sun without proper protection.

If you or your child experience any vision changes after the eclipse, contact your optometrist promptly. You can also contact 811 to get health advice from a registered nurse.

A reminder that university and college applicants should check their university/college account to review their transcript information. Also, students should be award that they must accept offers of admission in their OUAC or OCAS accounts by the deadline dates indicated by the postsecondary institution. The transmission of mid-term marks to OCAS and to OUAC will be on April  $25^{th}$ .

#### Full Disclosure Date

The full disclosure date is on Thursday, April 25th. Grade 12 students who wish to withdraw from a course that is not required for graduation or post-secondary purposes should discuss their request with their guidance counsellor before that date. If a student withdraws from a course after the full disclosure date, the mark for the withdrawn course will appear on the student's transcript.


This year's graduation date will be on Thursday, June 27<sup>th</sup>. More details will be made available in May.

Hello.

You are receiving this message to clarify the information you received yesterday regarding school bus transportation for the 2024-25 school year.

If your student currently has school bus transportation and there is no change to their school or address in September, you do not need to take any action or reapply. Current school bus transportation will remain in place unless you are contacted directly by Tri-Board Student Transportation.

However, if you have a student for the 2024-2025 school year that:

- Is attending school for the first time (including Kindergarten students)
- Is changing schools (including elementary students transitioning to a secondary school)
- Needs to change school bus pick-up/drop-off locations (including changing childcare providers or if you are moving).

Then you need to apply for transportation with Tri-Board transportation by August 11, 2024 to ensure that you have transportation in place for the first day of school in September. Applications received after August 11 will not be processed before the first day of school. You can apply at: <a href="mailto:triboard.ca/apply/">triboard.ca/apply/</a>
