Principal's Report

- Next semester quads or semesters? A parent survey went out seeking input about what the
 preferred mode is. This survey was sent to parents from Algonquin & Lakeshore CDSB, Hastings
 Prince Edward DSB and Limestone DSB. Survey closes this Friday, December 10th and a decision
 will be made after it closes.
 - Question how are kids doing with the quadmester or octomester mode, vs. regular semesters? Answer – it's mixed. Students have a variety of preferences. Some like having only two courses at a time, while others prefer the stretched-out length of semesters.
- School picture day booked for Wednesday, January 5th
- Uniform committee a handful of students and staff have joined the committee. They have been asked to talk to whoever they can to get some ideas. Hopefully a meeting can be convened during early January to look at the McCarthy catalogue to see what we can find that matches the ideas gathered.
- School security systems are nearly 100% functional. We are looking at more cameras for inside of the school, but this year there have been incidences of vandalism to cars outside in the parking lot. The school board has hired a surveillance company who can purchase and install cameras for a much nicer price. Looking at relocating a camera from inside to outside, and to install additional cameras in a couple of blind spots that still exist within the school building. The cameras help school leaders and staff to deal with issues and concerns in a timely manner. The costs would be roughly \$2000 all-in. Asking if Catholic School Council would be able to contribute to this.

- Student awards from the 2020-2021 school year the school is working on this. The secondary side of thing is organized, but the elementary side is trickier due to a new student information system. The school is awaiting more information from the board, and once that is received, the awards will be presented to students. The goal is to keep the elementary and secondary awards ceremonies together, rather than separating the two, as this unites the school community.
